Canadian Legislative Changes Impacting Violence Against Women Spring 2022 – Summer 2023

National

Bills or acts that are of interest to VAW shelters and transition houses

- Bill C-233 (Keira's Law) will amend the Judges Act to ensure that judges receive training and
 education on domestic violence and coercive control in intimate partner and family
 relationships. This bill also includes electronic monitoring as a possible release condition for
 those facing domestic violence charges. This bill has received royal assent. Apr 2023
- Bill C-21 (Gun control amendments) would see newly manufactured guns, including those that
 fire in a "semi-automatic manner" and are designed to accept a magazine with more than five
 rounds, banned. This bill has passed second reading in the Senate. Jun 2023
- **Bill C-332 (Criminalization of Coercive Control)** would enact amendments to the criminal code to create an offence of coercive or controlling conduct. This bill was put forward by Laurel Collins and passed first reading. *May 2023*
- **Bill C-22 (Canada Disability Benefit)** will offer federal income supplement for low-income, working-age people with disabilities. This bill has received royal asset. *Jun 2023*

Court challenges

- Challenge to Bill C-51 saw the Supreme Court of Canada uphold privacy provisions for sexual
 assault survivors in criminal trials. This restricts the accused's ability to use a survivor's private
 records and allows survivors to decide how their private information can be used. Jun 2022
- Amendments to Bill C-28 (Self-induced extreme intoxication) were implemented when the Supreme Court of Canada found s 33.1 unconstitutional, which provided the possibility of the extreme intoxication defence again. Parliament re-enacted s 33.1, but it is only available to those that can prove beyond a reasonable doubt that a reasonable person could not foresee their loss of control and potential to do harm because of their intoxication. Other

Parliamentary hearings on Hockey Canada (Safe Sport in Canada) were held to investigate
Hockey Canada's handling of sexual assault allegations, as well as the organization itself and its
spending/funding. Jun-Nov 2022

The National Action Plan on Gender-Based Violence was announced in November 2022. It is a 10-year plan, with \$539.3 million committed for the first five years. Provincial/territorial agreements are to be signed in 2023.
