# Canadian Legislative Changes Impacting Violence Against Women January – June 2024

### Legislation

### National Legislative Changes Impacting Violence Against Women in Canada

- <u>Bill C-62</u> (An Act to amend an Act to amend the Criminal Code (medical assistance in dying))
  prevents people struggling with mental illnesses from getting medical assistance in dying. This
  bill received Royal Assent. Feb 2024
- <u>Bill C-63</u> (Online Harms Bill) seeks to protect Canadians from harmful content online, increasing online organizations' accountability and responsibility regarding online content. This bill is in second reading in the House of Commons. *Feb 2024*
- <u>Bill C-376</u> (An Act to amend the Criminal Code (orders prohibiting the possession of weapons))
  prohibits individuals from possessing a weapon for a determined period if they are convicted for
  using, threatening to use, or attempting to use violence against a person. This bill passed first
  reading in the House of Commons. Feb 2024
- <u>Bill S-205</u> (An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to another Act (interim release and domestic violence recognizance orders)) requires electronic monitoring bracelets to be worn by accused abusers while awaiting trial; they are required for those who are under a court order to stay away from a victim as well. This bill is at the report stage in the House of Commons. Feb 2024
- <u>Bill S-232</u> (Health-Centered Approach to Substance Use Act) seeks to develop a national strategy to decriminalize simple possession of illegal substances. This bill is under consideration in the Standing Senate Committee on Social Affairs, Science, and Technology. *Apr 2024*
- <u>Bill S-249</u> (An Act respecting the development of a national strategy for the prevention of intimate partner violence) develops a nation-wide strategy to prevent and combat IPV. This bill is under consideration in the Standing Senate Committee on Social Affairs, Science, and Technology. *May 2024*
- <u>Bill C-320</u> (An Act to amend the corrections and conditional release act (disclosure of information to victims)) mandates that all information disclosed to a victim of an offence regarding eligibility and review dates applicable must include an explanation of how the dates were determined. This bill is under consideration in the Standing Senate Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs. May 2024
- <u>Bill C-332</u> (An Act to amend the Criminal Code (controlling or coercive conduct)) criminalizes
  the exercise of coercive control against an intimate partner. This bill passed first reading in the
  Senate. *June 2024*
